#### **ENERGY VAMPIRES**

Sounds spooky, doesn't it? Energy vampires are electronics which use energy in standby mode, even when the device is not in use.

Duke Energy estimates vampires account for up to 20% of your electric bill!

Some items need to remain plugged in, such as those which use a timer to "wake up", like your DVR, alarm clock or coffee pot timer. Others, such as computers and peripherals, DVD players, gaming system and unused chargers, can be put on a power strip and turned off. Or use a "smart" power strip which cuts power when the devices are not in use.

#### **BACK TO SCHOOL**
