Stuffed Mini Peppers:

INGREDIENTS

10 mini sweet peppers 3/4 cup refried beans 1/2 cup jarred salsa verde

INSTRUCTIONS

Mix beans and salsa together. Salt and pepper to taste. Slice peppers lengthwise and take out the seeds. Fill with bean filling and bake on a cookie sheet for 15-20 minutes at 375 degrees.
